Annual conference success continues at 2013 event

THE National Farm Attractions Network (NFAN) held its annual conference and trade show at Drayton Manor Theme Park in Staffordshire on February 5th and 6th, the event once again enjoying strong support from operator and trade members from throughout the UK.

She concluded by noting that the tourism sector was growing significantly compared to the rest of the economy.

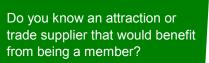
