# **Tourism Entrepreneur of the Year**

Chris Wilson, Streamvale
Farm, Belfast won the
'Tourism Entrepreneur of
the Year' award at the 40th
Northern Ireland Tourism
Awards. The special
anniversary event,
organised by Tourism NI
in association with Diageo
NI, was held at the Europa
Hotel in Belfast, where
the inaugural awards took
place in 1978.

He won the award for dramatically increasing visitor numbers to the farm through clever marketing and innovative events. This award also recognised that he had brought more money into the NI economy through tourism and, in turn,



has created four full time jobs at the farm in the past few years.

Chris said: "I am over the moon to win this award, it was a fantastic night! However, I couldn't have won this without such a great team around me! We have a lot of plans for the farm to continue to develop and grow and I am very excited about the future. The tourism industry is crucial to the Northern Ireland economy and we hope over the next 10 years this continues to grow significantly."



# **Countryfile Live**

Cotswold Farm Park were amongst the NFAN members to attend BBC Countryfile Live at Blenheim Palace in Oxfordshire this summer. Hosted by the stars of Countryfile, the show provides live entertainment including the Dog and Duck Show, falconry displays, livestock judging, auctioneering and even pig agility as well as live music and dancing, farm machinery displays, the chance to visit the animal petting farm and enjoy delicious food stalls.

Jack Walton is a 3rd year student at The Royal Agricultural University in Gloucestershire and managed the Adam's Farm Area along with Kate Lord. He said: "We took around 100 different animals to the show from farms from all over the UK including Cannon Hall Farm

Park. We really enjoyed educating and engaging with members of the public, many of whom know very little about farming. I'm very grateful to all the volunteers from Cotswold Farm Park, Rand Farm Park, Streamvale and White Post who helped with the event; I'm sure their experience of the four-day show will enable them to take ideas back to their own farms."

# Animal Attraction Assurance Scheme

One third of NFAN members have already taken up the industry code of practice certification scheme. The Animal Attraction Assurance (AAA) Scheme was launched earlier this year and audits have been taking place over the summer and will continue into the autumn for those who have signed up so far.

Tom Robinson heads the NFAN sub-committee which has been working with Kiwa Agri Food Ltd to develop the scheme. He said: "I'm really pleased with the take-up so far. The volume of farm parks who are committing to the scheme speaks for itself, and we're certainly reaching the targets we thought we'd achieve when we launched it at the NFAN conference and trade show in January.

"The feedback that I've received from NFAN members who have gone through the audit is that only very minor issues have been raised, and they have been reassured that they are compliant and helping to raise the industry standard."

Rebecca Burniston from Brimham Rocks Adventure Farm and Riggmoor Reindeer & Co in North Yorkshire achieved AAA certification in August. She said: "We'd previously operated on a mobile basis but have recently opened our doors to educational visits. We wanted to offer our customers the reassurance and peace of mind that they're working with a certified and professional organisation and that's what I feel the AAA scheme has given us. It was also really valuable for us to have a different pair of eyes reviewing the way that we do things. The ladies from Kiwa were absolutely lovely - very constructive and helpful, and not critical at all. The audit revealed that, as we thought, we weren't

perfect, but the issues that were raised were not major and have been easy to rectify. It makes us feel that we are doing things right and are on a par with others in the industry. It's a real stamp of approval and a fantastic initiative from NFAN."

One of the many benefits of the scheme is that insurance companies that are NFAN trade members - Bridle Insurance, Lorica Insurance and Marsh & Co - will reduce premiums by 7.5% to 10% for farm parks that agree to and pass annual AAA audits.

After last year's trip to Belfast this year's annual roadshow tour took over 40 NFAN members across the sea again, but this time a shorter hop to the Isle of Wight.







The three-day tour started in Southampton with a visit to Longdown Activity Farm. Brian and Dawn Pass, their daughter Kerry and the rest of the team welcomed the group with a buffet lunch before heading off for a guided tour. Delegates had the opportunity to try out the crazy golf and participate in the lamb feeding. Many of the group were keen to know more about the Changing Places disabled toilet with adult-sized changing bench and lifting hoist built into a container.

The following morning the coach took us to the Red Funnel ferry for the one-hour crossing to the Isle of Wight. First stop was the Garlic Farm, where owner Colin Boswell met the group with a tractor trailer to take us past the garlic fields to the main restaurant where his daughter Natasha was waiting with a delicious garlic inspired lunch, complete with garlic beer and delicious garlic ice cream.

The second stop of the day was Robin Hill, where park manager James Crofts gave an insight into the 88-acre country park attraction. We saw the new Jungle Heights tree top nets being installed and had the chance to ride the toboggan run, Galleon swing and other fun activities.

Final stop of the day was Tapnell Farm Park, winner of this year's Small Farm Attraction of the Year. Tom Honeyman Brown and the Tapnell team gave us a thorough tour of the farm park and the range of eco lodges, pods, cabins and safari tents which, together with rooms in Tapnell Manor, would be our accommodation for the night. After everyone had checked in, and some had taken advantage of the hot tubs, we met for drinks in the onsite Cow Co Restaurant followed by a delicious three course dinner. The party continued on into the night at Tapnell Manor where darts and table tennis in the games room were popular distractions.

The next day, it was just a short coach journey to The Needles Landmark Attraction where manager Marino Zanti

gave us the history of the attraction and answered questions, before we were left in the capable hands of marketing manager Rachael Hardiman. Glass blowing and sweet making demonstrations were followed by the chairlift ride down the cliff to the beach where we boarded the pleasure boat for a tour out to The Needles. On our return to shore there was just enough time to visit some of the other attractions and retail outlets including the famous Alum Bay Sand Shop.

Thanks to Roadshow Tour sponsor Omar Park Developments (and for the branded pens and mugs) and to all the attractions we visited who were amazingly generous with their hospitality and time. The NFAN summer roadshow tour is a great opportunity to spend some quality time with other farm park operators in a relaxed setting and meet with the owners and managers of different attractions. It takes place mid-June each year, details of next year's tour dates and location will be announced in the new year.

# A corny open day











York Maze is the UK's biggest maize maze and one of region's most popular summer attractions. It boasts over 20 attractions, rides and shows with punny names like the Crowmania ride, the House of Cornfusion, the Corn Snake slides, Cobstacle course, the new Volcorno climb and more.

Many members arrived the day before and took the opportunity to visit two other York-based NFAN members, Piglets Adventure Farm and The Web Adventure Park. There was an opportunity to join a guided walking tour of York's historic highlights before meeting for dinner at the DoubleTree by Hilton.

Open Day delegates heard from York Maze owner Tom Pearcy about the history of the attraction which first opened in 2002 and, after a forced move to a new site 10 years ago, is now a well-established and popular attraction. Tom also spoke about how Halloween has been a big growth opportunity, particularly the Hallowscream nights for adults which now occupy a dedicated section of the site. Vikki Howarth from York Maze talked about the wedding side of the business and David Leon, York Maze's marketing and PR consultant, talked about the power of gathering and analysing visitor survey data and postcodes. Delegates split into groups for guided

tours of the site before time for lunch and the opportunity to select from any of York Maze's catering outlets.

Thanks to York Maze for hosting the event, to open day sponsors Timberplay and Innovative Leisure; SPI Global Play for sponsoring the wine at the networking dinner; and Piglets Adventure Farm and The Web Adventure Park for opening their doors to NFAN members the day before. The next open day is at Mead Open Farm on 5th December.
