Congratulations to all the Farm Parks who have successfully achieved Animal Attraction Assured certification.

Over 60 farm parks applied in the first year and two thirds have now had their certificates issued, most of the rest still have one or two corrective actions to undertake. As insurance renewal time comes around, we expect AAA certified members will start to see real savings of up to £1500pa in insurance premiums. NFAN is conducting a review with Kiwa into the first year of the scheme, all those who registered should have received an email asking for feedback. NFAN are keen to increase member participation in the scheme and would be

interested to hear from nonparticipants about any issues with the scheme.

New applications save £150 - when the scheme launched at the conference last year NFAN offered a £150 discount to all registrants.
